Our not-for-profit healthcare System includes:

Our research and academic superlatives include:

- Our research partner, the Emory University Department of Pediatrics, is ranked **No. 4** nationally in National Institutes of Health (NIH) funding for pediatric departments.
- 60 principal investigators from Children's and Emory led projects to study SARS-CoV-2 resulting in **145** publications.
- Marcus Autism Center is one of only **five** centers nationwide to be designated an Autism Center of Excellence by the NIH.
- The Aflac Cancer and Blood Disorders Center is ranked **No. 1** in the country for therapeutic clinical trial enrollment, with more than **400** clinical studies available for patients, 28 Aflac investigator-initiated clinical trials, and more than 1,100 study enrollments in 2021. The Center is one of the largest brain tumor and leukemia/lymphoma programs in the country and is also home to the largest pediatric sickle cell disease program in the country, caring for more than **2,200** children with sickle cell disease.



In 2021, we managed:

- **1,091,000+** patient visits
- **414,000+** unique patients
- **41,000+** surgical cases (inpatient and outpatient)

STRONG⁴LIFESM

In 2021, Strong4Life continued to focus on childhood obesity, illness and injury prevention, child protection, and behavioral and mental health.

Together, our child advocacy efforts through Strong4Life reached more than 645,500 children.

- **Obesity prevention** programs reached 381,351 children and 229 schools.
- **Behavioral health** programs trained 163 clinicians and reached 147,145 children with programs and messaging aimed to build resilience.
- **Injury and illness prevention** programs and messaging reached 124,112 children. Through the YMCA partnership, we provided 189 swim lesson vouchers to kids, hosted land-based safety around water classes for 1,738 children and water-based safety around water classes for 834 children.
- **Child protection** programs reached 1,903 children with child protection programs that address child abuse, child neglect and child sex trafficking.
