

MENTORING PROGRAMS

The Katherine Dodd Faculty Scholars Program is a two-year focused career development scholars program for clinician educators. Since its inception in 2009, 36 faculty members have participated in the Dodd Scholar Program.

The Hazinski Society for Junior Faculty

Development was established in 2011. Composed of 8-10 faculty with senior faculty members serving as facilitators, each mentoring group meets monthly to provide a framework for peer-mentorship and networking within the department. The Hazinski Society's mission is to enhance career development skills for members of the Department of Pediatrics. Faculty members learn skills and receive guidance in accessing resources for successful careers in academic medicine. The Hazinski Society is named in honor of Dr. Tom Hazinski and continues his legacy of encouraging faculty development. Hazinski Society leaders presented their workshop "Habits of Highly Successful Academicians: Making Your Grandmother (and Your Department Chair) Proud" at three national/ international conferences. They have also published two articles describing their work.

EDUCATION

We regularly present workshops on topics related to work/life balance, education, annual reviews, setting SMART goals, time management and career development. We also have produced Setting SMART Goals podcasts and videos.

Our team is available to meet with faculty for individual coaching interviews and in group meetings to present mini-workshops on relevant topics.

DIVERSITY

The Department of Pediatrics is committed to fostering an inclusive environment where individuals from diverse backgrounds are able to thrive. The Office of Faculty Development plays a key role in faculty recruitment and leadership searches, onboarding, leadership development, and coordinating networking and mentoring opportunities. The Office of Faculty Development interfaces with the Office of Inclusion and Health Equity and the Vanderbilt University Medical Center Office for Diversity Affairs.
