In our 24,000 square-foot Multidisciplinary Clinic space on Anschutz Medical Campus, supersize exam rooms, multiple play areas and high-tech teleconferencing equipment offer kids with complex needs a full spectrum of treatment, all on one day, in one place.

Our commitment to multidisciplinary care doesn't end there. It's a philosophy we put to work in everything we do, at the bedside, in the clinic and all over the region.

Here, research is the act of hope

As an academic hospital, we're actively involved in researching new treatments and cures. We've pioneered many first-in-medicine advances, such as the discovery of toxic shock syndrome and the first drug to treat the underlying genetic basis of cystic fibrosis, and we continue to elevate the standard of care. We offer — and develop — the most up-to-date treatments available.

Our hundreds of research efforts range from the intuitive to the mindbogglingly complex, but they share a simple goal: the eradication of childhood disease.

We treat more and heal more kids than any other hospital in our region.


- We are Colorado's only licensed specialty hospital exclusively for children.

- Our Level IV Neonatal Intensive Care Unit offers the smallest patients the highest level of acute care.


